

HONORS LIBERAL ARTS (B.A.)

Suggested Degree Pathway

- All Honors courses are offered twice a year in different time slots (with the exception of HON 2000 and HON 3200, see below) to accommodate scheduling.
- The first year of Honors courses must be taken together but all other courses can be flexibly scheduled when time permits.
- HON 4899: Honors Capstone (1-5) must be taken in the final year of honors study for a total of 5 credits to prepare for the Honors Research Symposium – and at least one credit of HON 4899 taken in both Autumn and Spring Quarters that year.
- All Honors Majors must complete a disciplinary major, as well, and satisfy the following: all UFND requirements in the General Education Curriculum (10-15 credits, based on class standing at entrance); foreign language competency; CUE (Cultural Understanding and Engagement); and W (Writing) requirements.

FIRST YEAR IN HONORS

Students must take **all three Honors Core courses in their first Honors year**. *HON 2000: Culture and Social Systems* is only offered in Autumn Quarter and is designed to be the on-ramp course for all honors study at SPU.

SECOND AND THIRD YEARS IN HONORS

Students should take the **3000-level Honors courses in any quarter** that fits their schedule – with the exception of HON 3200: Honors Research and Writing which must be taken in the Winter Quarter of the third year only. The HON 3950: Honors Advanced Studies requirement (10 credits) may also be filled by any upper-division SPU course with the forthcoming “H” designation as well as **approved study abroad** courses. **All 3000-level Honors courses should be completed before taking HON 4899: Honors Research Capstone.**

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FOURTH YEAR IN HONORS

A **total of five credits** of HON 4899: Honors Research Capstone must be completed for graduation. And students must register for at least one credit of this course in both Autumn and Spring quarters. **All students are required to present at the Honors Research Symposium in spring quarter in order to graduate.**
